




12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On January 21, 2016, the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office held a training session for Chiefs of Police and their staffs regarding new County protocols for the investigations of both domestic violence and sexual assault cases. Chief Kozeniewski and Detective Sergeant George Moyer III attended the training.
- The Chief and the Sergeant, as well as representatives from local police departments and the PA State Police, met with key personnel from the Souderton Area School District to review and clarify the investigative processes with the new school district police officer. The meeting was very beneficial to our continuing working relationships.
- The department took full ownership of our Custom Signals speed display trailer in January. We had purchased this unit fifteen years ago in a joint venture with the Lower Salford and Towamencin Township Police Departments. Those departments have purchased other equipment for their needs. The trailer still has plenty of useful life and will afford FTPD year-round use to display at our various traffic trouble spots.
