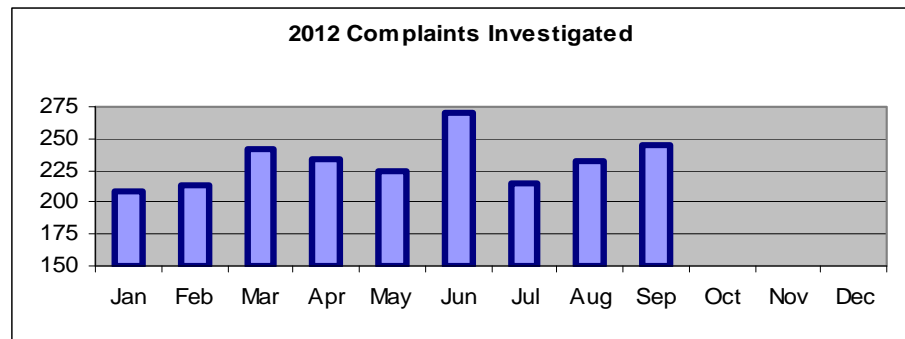
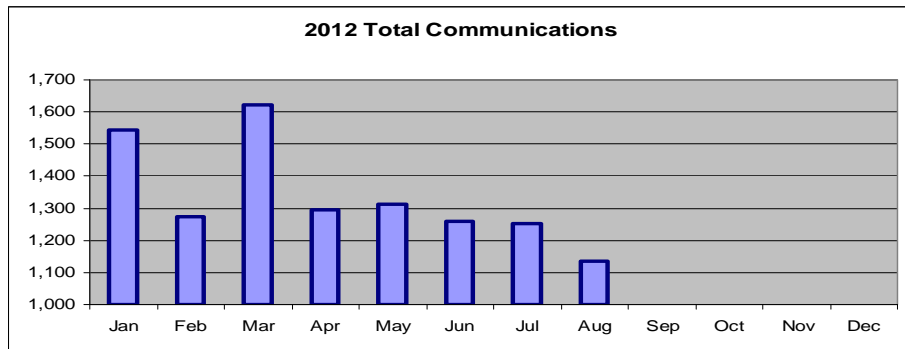



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- Officer David Klepfer introduced the D.A.R.E program at the Indian Crest Junior High School. This is the first year that the program will be taught at the 7th grade level
- On September 11th, Officer Klepfer and Det. George Moyer attended the monthly high school – juvenile information exchange meeting at the Souderton Area High School.
- Several members of the department provided assistance to the Plymouth Twp. Police Department after the line-of-duty shooting death of Officer Brad Fox on September 13th. Officers Steve Cronin and Kurt DeForrest responded to the initial request for countywide assistance in the search for the gunman immediately after the shooting. Chief Kozeniewski assisted with coordination of the activities at the church on the day of the funeral. Officers Kranich and DeForrest assisted with patrol coverage during the funeral proceedings.
- Officers Tim Boyle and Dave Klepfer assisted the members of the Hopewell Community Church with a bicycle rodeo for their children.
- The department hosted a prescription drug take-back program in conjunction with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration of September 29th. Residents deposited approximately nineteen pounds of outdated and unwanted medications into the recently installed drop-off box in the police department lobby.
