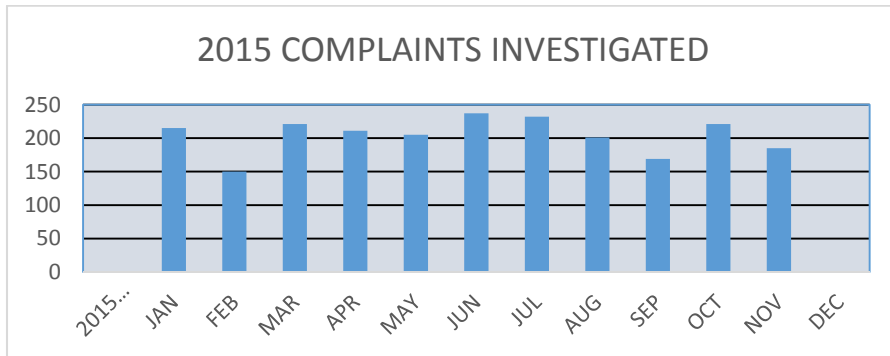
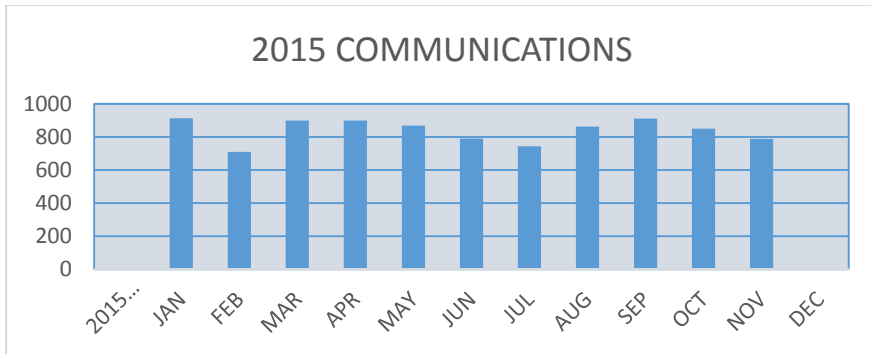



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- During the month, Corporal Ed Hall and Officer Travis Bivighouse conducted the final training sessions for firearms qualifications of the police officers.
- On November 12th, Det. Sgt. George Moyer and Officer Tim Boyle served the holiday turkey lunch to the students at West Broad Street Elementary School.
- A 77-year old local woman died from her injuries that were sustained in a four-vehicle crash on November 25th at the intersection of Harleysville Pike and Keller's Creamery Road. Two other persons were hospitalized with serious injuries. An ongoing investigation of the incident is being conducted by the police department and the Montgomery County Detectives' Bureau. This is the first highway fatality in the township since December of 2011.
- Det. Sgt. Moyer spearheaded an investigation of multiple thefts of money from bank accounts. As a result of his investigation, the bank's branch manager was charged with illegally removing the money for her personal gain. The manager is currently awaiting a preliminary hearing.
