



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- During June, various officers were assigned to several extra-duty details. The events are as follows:
 - Souderton Area High School Graduation Exercises

 - o DUI Checkpoint

These details resulted in the payment of 58 hours of overtime to our officers. However, the organizers of each activity have already or will reimburse the township for all of the hours worked.

- Some notable trends during the month:
 - o The number of family domestic calls as well as the number of DUI arrests, showed slight increases.
 - Most of the other categories have remained constant. We are averaging one burglary per month.
 - o There was a moderate increase in the number of soliciting permits that were issued. Several of the energy choice companies have hired crews of students to do door-to-door solicitations.
