




12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On May 3rd, Officer Glenn Kranich was re-certified as an instructor for the Taser devices that are carried by our officers. Each of the patrol officers then received their bi-annual certification training from Officer Kranich.
- On May 11th and May 12th, three representatives from the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association conducted an assessment of the department's files and practices. They found that we fully complied with the standards for the Pennsylvania Police Accreditation program. This is the second time that Franconia Twp. PD has been re-certified as an accredited agency. The department first achieved this distinction in 2010. The certification period will cover the next three years.
- Officer Eric Frary received his update training for the County Drug Task Force on May 19th.
