

POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

<u>August 6 – 10</u> - Officer Ryan Kochersperger successfully completed the Law Enforcement Firearms Instructor Certification Course presented by the National Rifle Association. Ofc. Kochersperger will now conduct all of the Franconia Township Police Department's officer firearms qualifications.

August 16 – The Police Command & Supervisory Staff met to discuss operational strategies, policy & procedure and departmental concerns. The meeting was very positive with all attendees in alignment with the projected departmental goals and objectives.

August 27 – Chief Martin & Det. Sgt. Moyer hosted a meeting with Souderton Area School District Police and newly appointed Director of Student Affairs, Megan Zwieback to discuss inter-agency protocols and operating procedures. A firm foundation was established to further enhance the existing positive working relationship between the township's police department and the school district police.

Back to School - Officers serviced and programmed flashing school zone lights in preparation for the start of the school year. Additionally, driver and pedestrian safety tips were provided to township staff for inclusion on the website and Twitter account.

August 28 – Officers periodically visited each of the township' schools during the first day to welcome students while ensuring safety.

August 29 – Officer Jim Throop went above the call of duty while handling a request to check the welfare of an 88 year old female resident. On one of the hottest days of the year, Ofc. Throop found the elderly woman in her house with her air conditioner off. Ofc. Throop convinced the woman to let him turn on the A/C unit and get her something to drink. Finding no juice in the refrigerator, Ofc. Throop drove to Wawa and purchased two different juices and returned to the home to serve the woman. Ofc. Throop then returned five hours later to check on the woman who was resting comfortably with the air conditioner still running.
