## **POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH 2019**

**March 5 – Department Administration** – The Police Department’s Policies and Procedures underwent scrutiny during a mock assessment for PA State Re-accreditation. Three assessors from outside jurisdictions spent a full day examining the operations & practices of the police department, in preparation for an on-site assessment on May 9, 2019.

**March 6, 13, 20 27 - Community Relations** – Officer Tim Boyle along with other FTPD Officers and members of several county agencies conducted sessions of the Citizen Police Academy. The classes included such topics as Police K-9, Bomb Unit, Vehicle Rescue, Social Media/Human Trafficking and CPR & First Aid Certifications.

**March 11 – Police Operations** – Officer Eric Frary testified during the trial of Luciana Stock, who was charged with the death of Franconia Township Public Works Employee David Smith and the severe injuring of fellow employee, Jeffrey Moyer. Public Works employees Chad Martin and John Mininger also testified during the day-long trial which ended in a guilty verdict on all counts. Chief Martin and Cpl. Ed hall also attended the trial.

**March 18 – Community Relations** – Chief Martin participated in a news conference announcing the initiation of Penn DOT’s Aggressive Driving Prevention wave of enforcement. This is the first year that the Franconia Township Police Department has participated in the enforcement program. A video of the news conference has been posted on the Township’s Web Site and on the Police Department’s Facebook Page.

**March 30 – Community Relations** – Chief Martin, Supervisor & Mrs. David Fazio and Supervisor Dr. Charles Amuso represented Franconia Township at the Souderton Fire Department’s Annual Banquet and Awards Ceremony.
