POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH OF JULY 2019

Public Safety - Traffic Enforcement – During the month of July, our patrol officers participated in the “Buckle up PA” safe driving/seat belt initiative, funded by a grant through the PA Department of Transportation. Officers patrolled on varying shifts which were dedicated solely to enforcement regarding aggressive driving and seat belt violations.

July 8 - Community Relations – Det. Sgt. Moyer, Officers Boyle & Kranich and Police Administrative Assistant Pam Paraskewik participated in the Souderton Area School District’s Summer Lunch Program. Our department members worked alongside teachers, district personnel and volunteers to assemble and deliver approximately 150 bag lunches for children who typically receive subsidized meals throughout the school year.

July 10– Community Relations – Patrol officers assisted with traffic control for participants in the annual Moyer 5K run throughout the township. Organizers report that this year’s event was attended by more participants than any other year.

July 30 – Community Engagement – Chief Martin participated in a work session at the Montgomery County Victim Services Center, wherein a committee is revising policy for the county’s Sexual Assault Response Team Protocol.

July 31 – Community Response – Chief Martin and Perserverance Fire Department Assistance Chief Steve Coll attended a disaster preparedness briefing at the JBS Facility, as mandated by the US Department of Homeland Security. The focus of the meeting was to share information and coordinate response capabilities in the event of an industrial incident.
