POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL 2019

March 18 through April 28 – Aggressive Driving Enforcement - The police department participated for the first time in Penn DOT's Safe Driving Grant Program, which focused on the enforcement of laws to combat aggressive driving. During this enforcement wave 49 vehicles were stopped and 33 citations were issued for various moving violations. Officers Boyle, Kranich, Kochersperger and Cpl. Cronin worked extra-duty shifts (enforcement patrols) designed specifically focus on motorist safety.

<u>April 5 - Community Relations</u> — Officers Boyle, Kochersperger, Cpl. Cronin and Det. Sgt. Moyer lent a helping hand at the Franconia Elementary Candy Bingo Night. The officers checked bingo cards, called numbers and enjoyed an abundance of positive interaction with our residents.

<u>April 10 - Community Engagement</u> —The final class was held for the 2019 Citizen Police Academy. Special acknowledgement to Officer Tim Boyle for his tireless efforts in making this incredibly valuable program a huge success! The class participants will be recognized for their achievement during the May, 2019 monthly Board of Supervisors' Meeting.

<u>April 22 - Firearms Training</u> - Cpl. Hall, Officers Frary, Klepfer and Pursell attended Semi Annual firearms training which was conducted at the Montgomery County indoor shooting range. The instruction provided by Officer Kochersperger included shooting on the move and a qualification course of fire.

<u>April 25 – Community Relations</u> – Chief Martin and Det. Sgt. Moyer joined area police and school district officials in a meeting with members of the NAACP - Ambler Branch to discuss juvenile justice. The forum was hosted by the Ambler NAACP to create open dialogue and unity in better serving youth in the region. The Franconia Township Police Department is proud to partner with the NAACP in this continuing effort.

<u>April 27 – Community Relations</u> – Det. Sgt. Moyer, Officer Kranich and members of the Character Counts Coalition hosted National Drug Take Back Day at the Franconia Elementary School. This very successful four hour event yielded 54 pounds of medications, which were then added to another 114 pounds that was collected over the past several months in the medication drop box located in the police department lobby. In total, 168 pounds of unneeded prescription medications were turned over to the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office.
