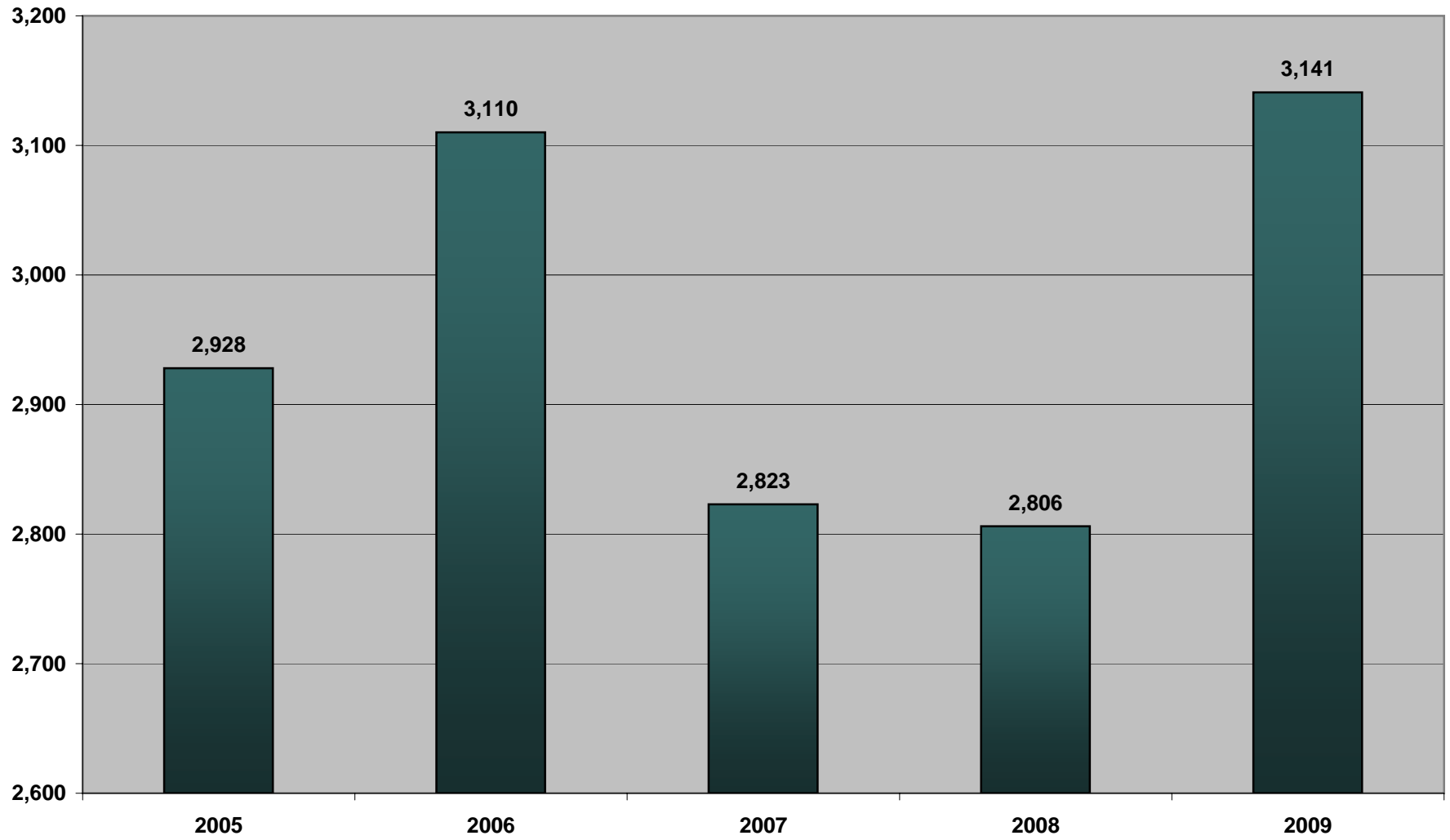

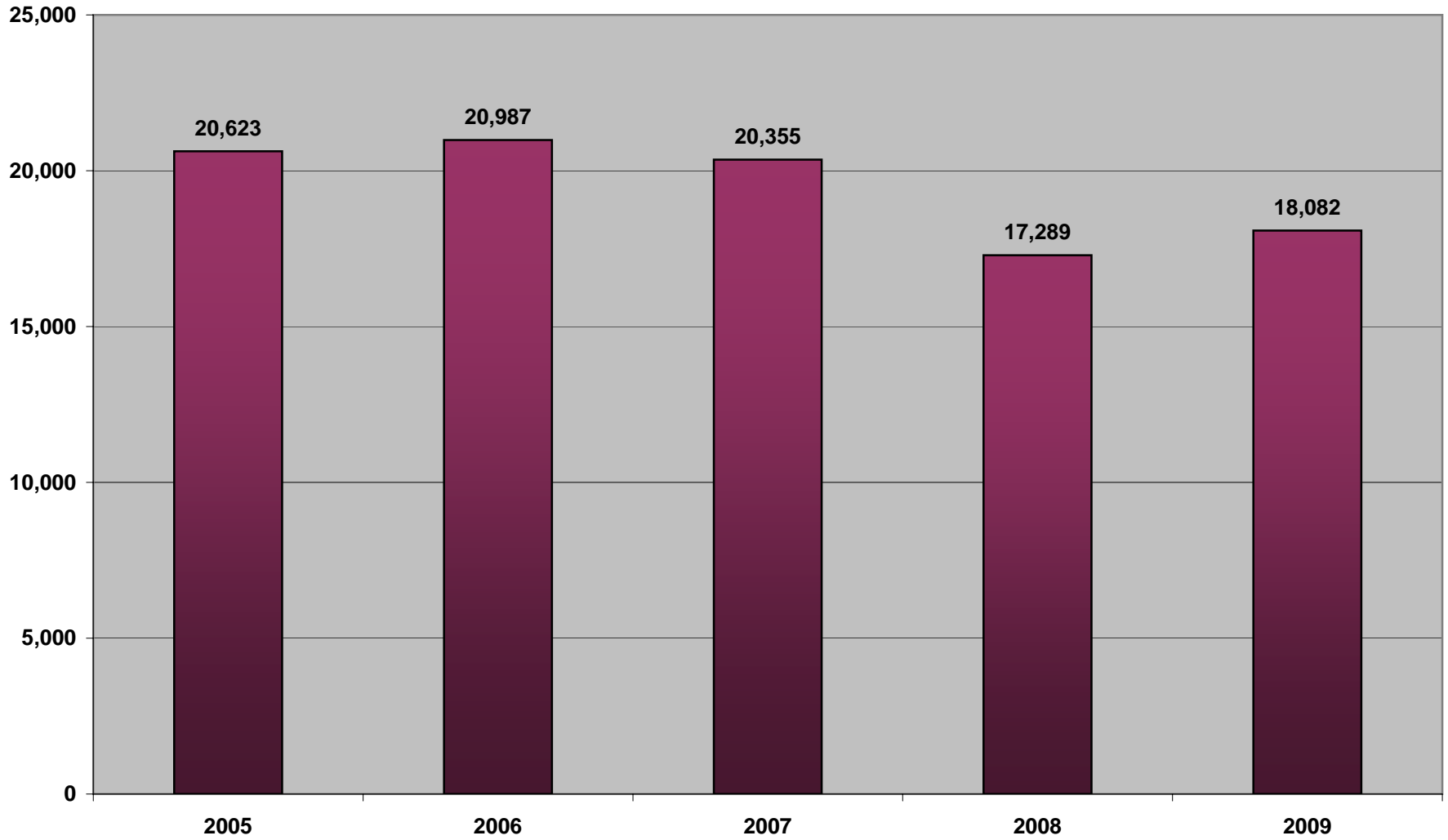

### Complaints 5 Year Comparison

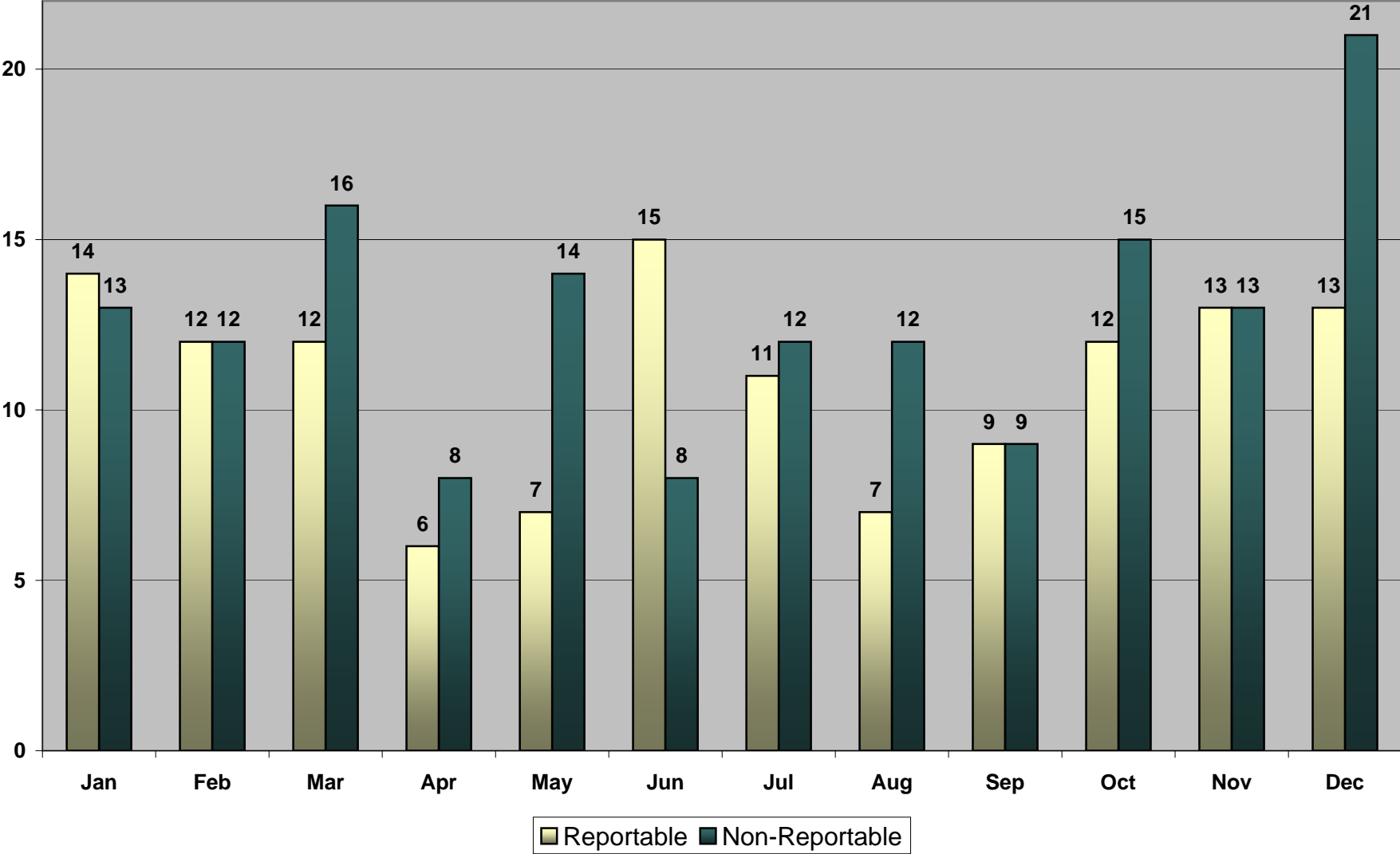

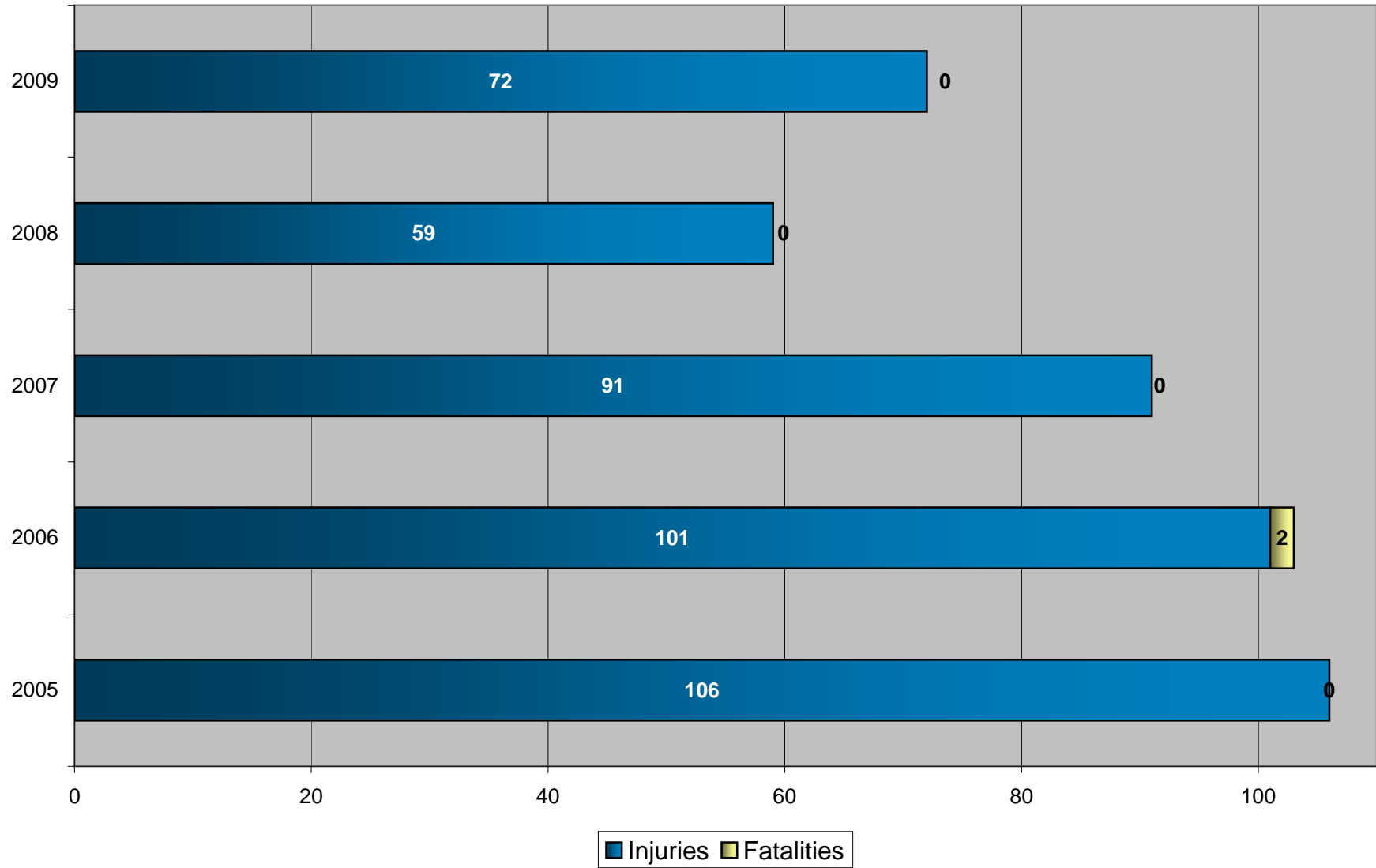




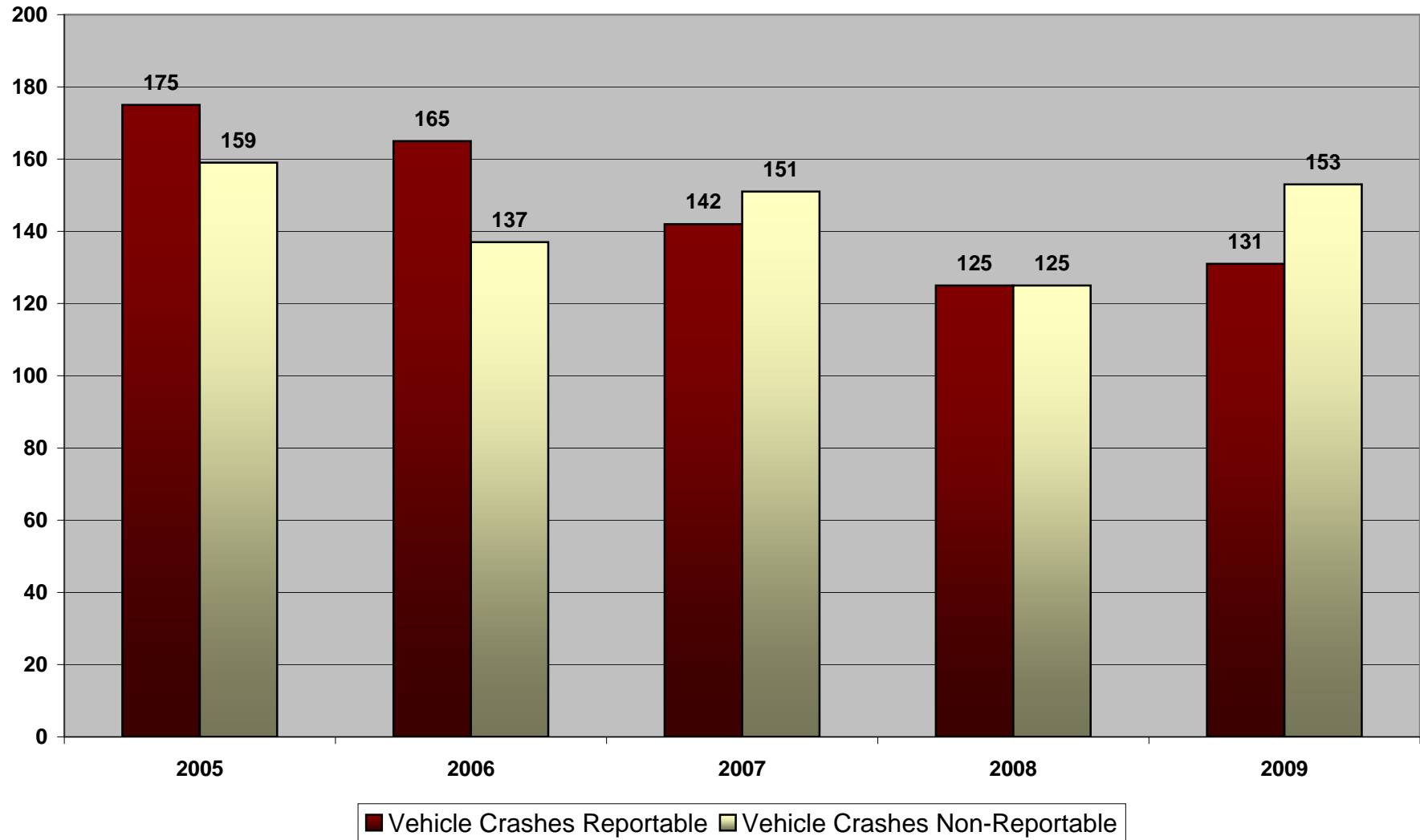
### Vehicle Crashes Comparisons by Month



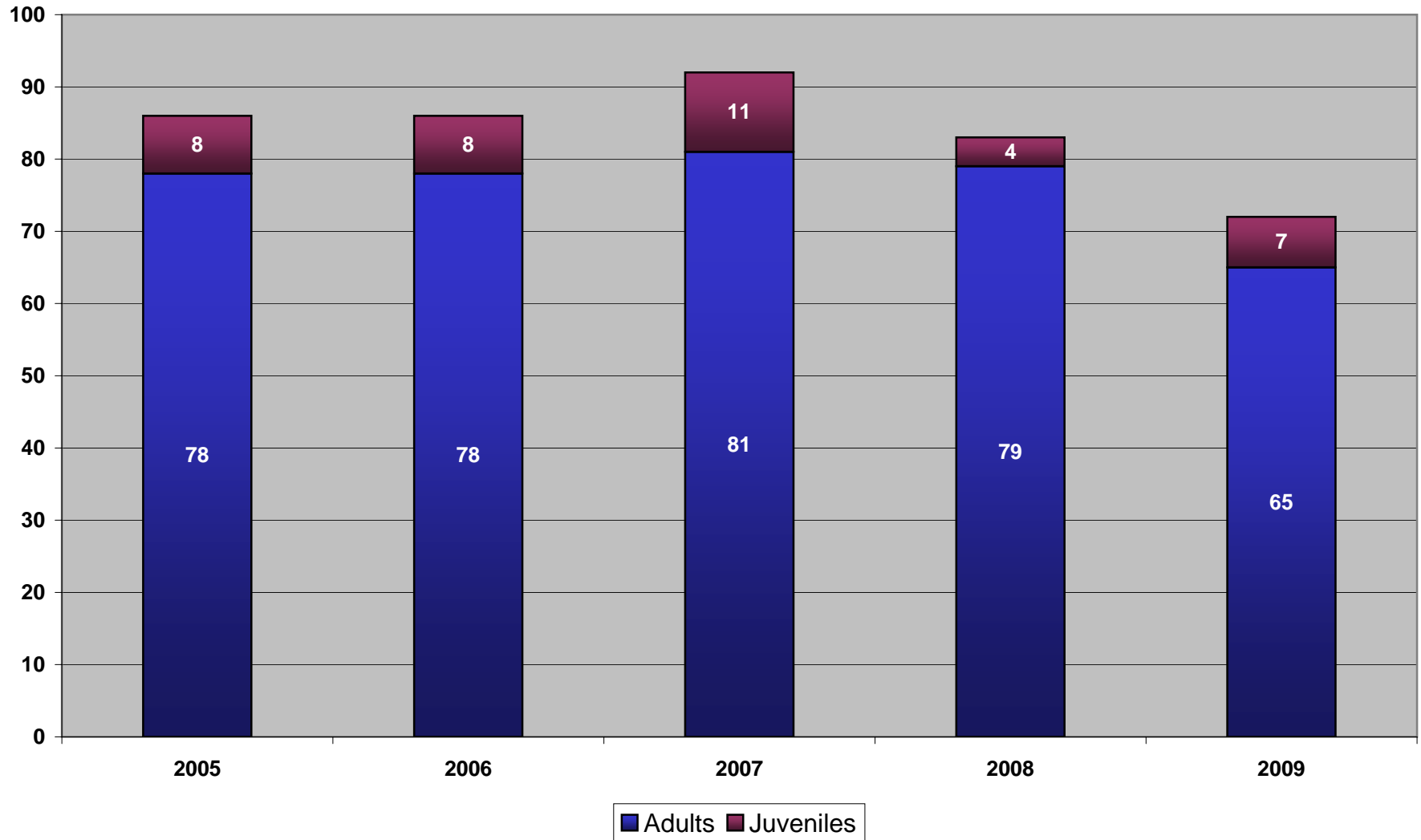
### Vehicle Crash Injuries & Fatalities 5 Year Comparison

**August 4** – Displayed the D.A.R.E. Car at our “National Night Out” event at the Franconia Community Park.


**August 20** – Displayed the D.A.R.E. Car at Senator Greenleaf’s “Night Out” event at Lukens Park in Horsham Township.

## BACKGROUND

The Franconia Township Highway Safety Unit (HSU) was created in 2006. The officers who make up this unit specialize in the areas of traffic enforcement, motor carrier safety, and accident investigation/reconstruction. Along with the other members of the police department, the officers on the HSU strive to ensure safety on the township's roadways. For 2009, the Franconia Township Police Department had over 4,000 traffic-related public contacts.

## STATISTICS

### ENFORCEMENT

- **1,858** Traffic Citations were issued.
- **129** Faulty Equipment Notices were issued.
- **2,019** Verbal or Written Warnings were issued.

### OTHER STATISTICS

- Officers assisted **97** disabled motorists over the course of the year.
- The JAMAR<sup>®</sup> traffic counter was used once during the year.
- Officers removed **47** hazardous road obstructions from the roadways.
- The speed display unit was utilized at **18** different locations in 2009.
- Officers conducted **1,522** traffic enforcement details throughout the township.
- **8** Child Safety Restraint checks were conducted.
- **23** Roving DUI Details were conducted.
- Officers assisted **78** motorists with vehicle lock-outs.
- Traffic control was conducted **243** times in the township. This includes accident scenes, funerals, and special events/details.

## ACCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

Officers responded to a total of **284** traffic accidents in 2009. Of those accidents:

- **131** were classified as **REPORTABLE** where at least one vehicle had to be towed and/or injuries were reported.
  - In 2009, **72** people were injured as a result of motor vehicle accidents in Franconia Township.
- **153** were classified as **NON-REPORTABLE** where no injuries were reported and no towing of vehicles was involved.



## MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTIONS (MCSAP)



- In 2009, the Franconia Township Police Department became a member of the Montgomery-Bucks Motor Carrier Enforcement Team (MCET). This unit operates in both counties and is made up of specially trained officers from Hatfield Township, Montgomery Township, Cheltenham Township, Abington Township, Horsham Township, Whitemarsh Township, and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency.
  - Two MCET enforcement details were conducted in Franconia Township in 2009. The combined results of these details are as follows:
    - Officers made contact with **91** drivers.
    - **17** Level 1 Inspections were conducted. (A Level 1 Inspection is a thorough driver and vehicle inspection which includes all documents, equipment, and brakes. These guidelines are established by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance.)
    - **53** Violations were noted. As a result, warnings and/or citations were issued.
    - **3** Arrests were made.
    - **12** Vehicles were placed Out-Of-Service due to major safety violations.
- For the entire year, the township's motor carrier officers conducted the following:
  - **75** Level 1 Inspections (Some of these inspections were conducted outside Franconia Township.)
  - **242** Violations were discovered.
  - **50** Vehicles or drivers were placed Out-Of-Service for major safety violations.
- Some of the violations discovered during motor carrier enforcement details include:
  - Faulty brakes and air brake leaks.
  - Drivers with expired or no medical card (Driver's operating motor carrier vehicles must be cleared by a doctor every two years).
  - Unlicensed drivers operating commercial motor vehicles and driver's operating without the proper class of CDL.
  - Equipment violations including: faulty lighting, low tire tread, missing parts, and oil leaks. Non-equipment violations including unsecured loads and overweight.

### HIGHWAY SAFETY UNIT TRAINING

- Officer Albert Gesullo and Corporal Stephen Rinker attended MCSAP updates.
- Officer Kurt DeForrest, Officer Steven Cronin, and Corporal Stephen Rinker attended the two-week On-Scene and Homicide-By-Vehicle Accident Investigation Course.
- Officer Derek Alspach and Officer James Throop attended a two-day course on DUI Testifying and DUI Enforcement.
- Officer Chris Hinnershitz, Officer Derek Alspach, and Officer James Throop attended On-Scene Collision Investigation, which was a four-day course.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES FOR 2009

### Personnel

- The department's fifteenth full time police officer received his oath of office at the Board of Supervisors meeting on January 19, 2009. Christopher Hinnershitz was sworn-in by Special Court Justice Kenneth Deatelhauser.
- Frank Del Vecchio, a student at the Penn State – Lehigh campus, completed his summer internship with the police department. He actively participated in the everyday activities of the police department and was especially helpful at events such as National Night Out and the DUI checkpoint in June.

### Enforcement Activities

- On June 12th, members of the department conducted a DUI Enforcement Checkpoint on Harleysville Pike near Moyer Road. Officers arrested eight persons for driving under the influence and removed several other drivers who had been drinking. Officers from other neighboring departments also participated under the auspices of the North Penn DUI Task Force.
- Officer Travis Bivighouse, Cpl. Steve Rinker, and Off. Al Gesullo hosted the Montgomery-Bucks Carrier Enforcement Team on August 27th. The team conducted safety inspections on motor carriers travelling through the township.

### D.A.R.E.

- Officer David Klepfer presented the Drug Abuse Resistance Education program to the fourth grade students at the Franconia, West Broad Street, and Vernfield Elementary Schools. The ten-week educational program ended with graduation ceremonies at each school.

- Officers attended the following functions with the department's D.A.R.E. vehicle:
  - The Crosspoints Baptist Church in Elroy on July 11<sup>th</sup> for their block party.
  - The Moyer & Son Health Fair at the Souderton Park on July 8<sup>th</sup>.
  - Officers also assisted with traffic control for the 5K race from that event.
  - Officer Klepfer drove the D.A.R.E. car in the Souderton Holiday Parade as well as the Banbury Crossing Caroling event.

### **National Night Out Against Crime**

- The department hosted its annual National Night Out Against Crime celebration on Tuesday, August 4, 2009. The displays and activities drew large crowds from Franconia Township and nearby municipalities. Janice Froshour coordinated the entire event.
- In November, the Police Department was selected by the National Association of Town Watch as a National Award Winner for our National Night Out Against Crime celebration.

### **Community Activities**

- On January 16<sup>th</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski and Sgt. Jeff Gower were the guests at a luncheon held by the new staff at the JBS Packerland plant (the former MOPAC.) The JBS staff used this opportunity for outreach to the local police, fire and EMS communities.
- Officers Klepfer and Wayne Pursell conducted the annual Bicycle Safety Rodeo at Franconia Elementary School.
- The department hosted a tour of the police facility for ten teen-aged exchange students from the Ukraine on July 14<sup>th</sup>.
- On September 8<sup>th</sup>, the new Souderton Area High School opened for over 2,000 students and staff. The police department worked with the school staff to coordinate a plan for traffic flow during the day.


- Six officers provided traffic control for the annual Uninvest Grand Prix bike race that was held on September 12, 2009.
- Officers Jim Throop and Kurt DeForrest represented the police department at the Fire Prevention Month presentations held by the Telford Fire Company and the Souderton Fire Company, respectively.
- On December 17th, Chief Kozeniewski participated in the Souderton-Telford Rotary Club's Holiday Party for children.

## **Training**

- Chief Kozeniewski received his certification for the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Level 300 in a training session at Abington.
- Officers Dave Klepfer, Derek Alspach, and James Throop attended the two-day Street Survival training school.
- Several members of the department staff attended a presentation on the new Open Records Law as it pertains to police departments. The presentation was made at the Whitemarsh Township Police Department.
- Officers Derek Alspach and James Throop attended a two day training class on DUI Enforcement and DUI Testimony in court. The class was held at the State Police Training Center in Skippack.
- The department hosted Rapid Response training sessions on June 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> at the new Souderton Area High School facility on Lower Road. Officers from Telford, Souderton, Lower Salford Township and Hatfield Township participated with all Franconia officers in the scenarios where an active shooter would be present in the school building or a business. Sergeant Jeffery Gower, Officer Glenn Kranich, and Officer Chris Hinnershitz coordinated the training.
- On July 21<sup>st</sup>, Sergeant Jeffery Gower attended a Leadership training class at the State Police Academy in Hershey.
- Officer David Klepfer attended the national D.A.R.E. conference during the week of July 20, 2009.

- Officer Travis Bivighouse renewed his firearms instructor's certification at a training session during the last week of July. He then conducted firearms training and qualifications for several officers at the County Public Safety Academy firearms range. Corporal Ed Hall conducted firearms qualifications for the remaining officers.
- Detective George Moyer participated in the Pennsylvania Juvenile Officers Association training conference. He is a member of the executive board of that organization.
- On November 19<sup>th</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski and Corporal Edward Hall attended a seminar on current police liability issues. It was held at the Montgomery County Public Safety Training Academy.
- All of the members of the department completed their annual mandatory legal update classes as authorized by the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission.
- On November 23<sup>rd</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski, Detective George Moyer III, and Officer Steve Cronin participated in an orientation briefing for the new Mission Kids office in East Norriton Township. Mission Kids was created, in part, by District Attorney Risa Ferman to provide a single site in which to interview victims of child abuse and to coordinate the efforts of all investigating agencies.
